## Playing karaoke using auxiliary equipment

You can also enjoy karaoke by connecting auxiliary equipment such as a VCR to the LINE IN AUDIO/VIDEO inputs on the player. The karaoke functions such as Vocal Select, Key Control, Appinuse, Karnoke Star, Vocal Support, and Karaoke Pon are available as they would be for discs.
